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## **CERTIFICATE OF SUITABILITY FOR SYNDICATION**

At the request of Mr. Frank Galluzzo of Supreme Syndications, I have examined the above filly at Bowral on the 31<sup>st</sup> October 2018. The examination was limited to a clinical examination, assessment of conformation, a videoscope examination and Radiographs of the front fetlocks and the Right hind fetlock.

At the time of examination, the filly was in good health and condition and free from signs of disease. No abnormalities were detected on auscultation of the heart and lungs, and the Cardinal signs were within normal limits.

Her body and leg conformation was within normal limits, in fact she has, in my opinion, an athletic scopey body. There were no signs of lameness when led at the walk. There was soft tissue swelling around the right hind fetlock but no sign of joint effusion or pain on flexion of the joint. In my opinion the swelling was the result of recent trauma to the outside of the fetlock.

Radiographs were taken of the Right hind fetlock to check for boney lesions. There was some roughening of the lateral distal Cannon, which supports my suspicion of the aetiology of direct trauma. This injury does not involve the weight bearing area of the joint and once the bone remodels and the inflammation subsides, the injury is unlikely, in my opinion, to be of clinical significance.

There were no significant lesions visible on the Radiographs taken of the front fetlocks.

Video Endoscope examination was performed with the Videoscope introduced through the Right nostril. There were no visible anatomical or pathological abnormalities visible at the time of examination. There was full and sustained abduction of both Arytenoid Cartilages, satisfying the condition of **Lane Grade 1**.

Within the limits of the examination there were no abnormalities present that would in my opinion prevent the chances of this horse withstanding the pressures of racing. In my opinion the filly is a suitable subject for syndication/sale as a racehorse.
