At the request of Mr Frank Galluzzo of Supreme Syndications Bluegrass Bloodstock has provided the following written valuation below for the 2yo Air Force Blue/Garnet Rose colt.

It must be noted that this valuation has been provided sight unseen, but we have taken into account the veterinary certificate provided by Silver Pines Veterinary Clinic on the 21/09/2020 which states that the Air Force Blue colt is in good health and condition, body and leg conformation is within normal limits, he has a grade 1 scope and his radiographs taken displayed no major abnormalities for his future as a racehorse.

It also must be noted that Bluegrass Bloodstock doesn't have any financial interest in this particular Air Force Blue colt and this valuation has been provided for the purpose of syndication.

In the photo and veterinary certificate provided the Air Force Blue colt looks well grown with nice length and muscle.

The colts sire Air Force Blue stands at Coolmore Stud America for the service fee of \$15,000 USD but he did stand the 2017 season at Coolmore Australia for \$16,500 when this colt was conceived. He only stood 1 season at stud in Australia. Air Force Blue was a champion European 2yo by War Front who was a Triple group 1 winner as a 2yo, winning the Dewhurst, National and Phoneix Stakes.

At the yearling sales in 2020 Australia Air Force Blue has had 21 yearlings sell at public auction for an average of \$71,380 AUD.

Air Force Blue is the best juvenile by War Front who became the highest priced stallion at stud in America 2019.

Garnet Rose the dam of the 2yo colt was a lightly raced mare winning 2 races in NSW from only 8 starts, including a city placing at Warwick Farm over 1400m.

At stud Garnet Rose is the dam of 5 foals, her daughter Fearless Rose has had 1 encouraging trial at Warwick Farm where she ran 3<sup>rd</sup> of 7 for Joseph Pride

I understand the Air Force Blue colt is currently completing his breaking in.

When valuing the Air Force Blue colt Bluegrass Bloodstock has taken into account his pedigree and veterinary certificate which states he is in good health, well grown with sound conformation, including grade 1 scope and no major abnormalities on radiograph. Bluegrass also takes into account that the Air Force Blue yearlings averaged \$71,380 at public auction in 2020.

It is in Bluegrass Bloodstock professional opinion that the 2yo Air Force Blue colt would have the present value of between \$40,000 to \$50,000 AUD.
